
Recreation Reserve

The Tolmie Recreation Reserve is run by a Committee of Management on behalf of DEWLP. We are entirely self funded and our main source of income comes from campers. We offer beautiful newly renovated showers and toilets, camp kitchen with woodfire, fireplaces, stables, electric BBQ and more. Camping (unpowered) can be amongst the lovely treed areas or park a van on the oval.

Of course the reserve is also a great place for locals to walk, exercise, take the dogs, take the kids to the playground, or kick a footy!

The reserve also hosts the Tolmie <u>Anzac Day</u> dawn service.
