Tolmie and District Fire Brigade

Just a bit longer!

We anticipate the end of the Fire Danger Period (FDP) to be declared somewhere in mid April – but please keep an eye on our Facebook page at www.facebook.com/TolmieCFA for an announcement of the exact date. Until then, you may not burn off in the open air without a permit. Around this time of year we always get a few callouts, either because someone has decided to "jump the gun" and light up a burn-off sooner than permitted, or does so in the first few days after the FDP ends but doesn't supervise it properly and it gets away. This is a waste of time for our volunteer members who have other things they would rather be doing, so please be respectful of the dates. When the FDP has ended, **if you are going to have a burn-off PLEASE REGISTER IT by calling 1800 668 511. Let your neighbours know as well!** This is all enormously helpful in preventing

unnecessary callouts...

Easter campfires

Because Easter is going to fall earlier than the end of the FDP, we need to issue a reminder about campfires, even if it's in your own yard or property. During the Fire Danger Period, if you wish to have a campfire for cooking or warmth, here are the constraints:

- Wind speed must be less than 10 kph
- Fire must be in a properly constructed fireplace, or a trench that is 30cm deep.
- The area 3 metres around and above the campfire must be clear of anything that can burn.
- Fire must not be greater than 1m x 1m in size.
- Must not be left unattended. There must always be someone there who is able to put it out.
- Must be extinguished when you leave.

Note that using a fireplace - even a properly constructed one - where the primary purpose is rubbish disposal, (such as burning off sticks, bark, leaf litter and other rubbish) constitutes using it as an incinerator, and unless the fire is fully contained so that sparks and embers cannot escape from any side (i.e. including having a proper fitting lid), this is not permitted either. Council bylaws may apply as well. Thanking you in advance – have a great Easter! Cheers, Milton

HIGH COUNTRY HOMESTEAD

This past month has seen a few changes and some sleepless nights here on the Homestead. New life has begun, but on the flip-side there have been some deaths and disappointments. As the 'farming folk' hereabouts say, "if you have live ones, you'll have dead ones". And we have had plenty of both.

Calving season began here a few weeks ago. We awoke one misty morning to a Mum nursing her little boy who had clearly been born throughout the night. It was lovely to watch them both together and heralded what we hoped would be a smooth and (relatively) stress free period. Weeks passed, with no further arrivals. Then one morning I got up to find 2 heifers, both presenting with hooves. After a while it was clear that neither were progressing, and in both cases the calves had to be pulled. Unfortunately both were stillborn, which was very upsetting, both calves were MASSIVE, like 4 month olds and there was no way they could have been birthed naturally. Two poddy calves were acquired for the Mums to nurse. One potential Mum wasn't interested and the other, my favourite heifer never managed to get back on her feet. After 10 days feeding and watering her by hand, countless injections and supplements, sitting with her for hours at a time keeping her company and trying to encourage her, I 'called time'. And I am left feeding two poddy calves. The problem we face is we had so much grass and clover in the paddocks that the Mums and their unborn calves were getting bigger and bigger – too big in fact.

The remaining pregnant heifers were locked up in a much smaller area, where their food intake could be more closely monitored. We started doing checks throughout the night in case their waters broke, then you have a 1.5 - 2 hour window for the calf to arrive safely. EVERY calf since then has had to be pulled, but luckily because action was taken quickly, everyone has lived. I'm feeling sleep-deprived and will be grateful when the remaining heifers have done their thing, at the time of writing this though they don't even look close.

Unfortunately my veggie garden had decided that this would be the best season in terms of produce, we have ever had. Over 40kg of tomatoes, 12 pumpkins, about 30 kg potatoes, 30 or so leeks and much, much more. We tried to preserve what we could, but the timing and our energy levels were not at there best and we shared a lot our bounty with friends and neighbours.

Things are starting to calm down a bit now and we still have sweetcorn, watermelon and more pumpkins and tomatoes to go, so there will be more opportunities to put stuff away into storage. Sometimes, despite your best efforts things don't always go to plan. Prioritise change and you just have to wing it and hope for the best.....

Wonderings from the Wombat



Easter is past and the mornings and evenings are getting cooler. It must be autumn.

The Gang-Gang Cockatoos have moved on, the Butcherbirds have arrived, and the chook pen is full of feathers. Hence, no eggs now until the days start to get longer and in the mean time some seriously scrawny-looking chooks.

We had over 3 weeks without rain from late February through to late March, the longest dry spell we've had this summer and everything dried off quickly. And that put an end to picking blackberries and spraying the blighters...phew.

And, I've been meaning to talk about Antlions. This is the second summer that these tiny, conical pits, up to 3 to 4 cm. across, have appeared in the fine, loose soil against the wall at the front of the house. After asking around, I was told that they are the sand traps that Antlion nymphs dig to capture ants and other insects. I had heard of them but the word 'lion' somehow conjured up an image of a largish, ferocious looking something, not an insect where the adult's maximum wingspan is 150mm. So now I know what these funny little craters are and the insect that digs them.

After writing of cooler mornings earlier in this 'wondering', this morning we woke to a light frost...I'm sure this is a bit early in the autumn for frost.

And if I think it's a bit early for frosts, I also think it's a bit late to be seeing Native Bluebells (wahlenbergia) in flower. We spotted some on the edge of Frascas Lane in March and I know that there are a few different species, but the ones we see on our block flowered in January.

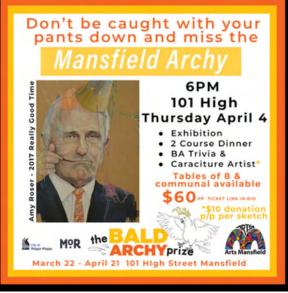
