
What's Next?

- 1. 17 November 2024 CFA 85th Celebration, Mural unveiling and Mini Emergency Services Expo: We have spoken with CFA representatives, and we have agreed to combine resources for community engagement and bushfire preparedness conversations.
- 2. **Community Input:** The draft content will be posted on Council website for broader community feedback and suggestions in the coming weeks. We plan to share the link through Tolmie Times so more people have access to it.
- 3. **Design and Distribution:** We have engaged a graphic designer to create an engaging and user-friendly format for the LEAP. Once finalised, it will be printed and distributed throughout the community. The map developed by the Resilience Benchmarking Project will be included.
- 4. **Endorsement Opportunity:** After finalising the LEAP, there may be an opportunity for community representatives to present it to the Municipal Emergency Management Planning Committee (MEMPC) for endorsement, likely in the new year.


A reminder that Casserole Nights are the 4th Friday of the month (not the last Friday). October's night is the 25th at 7pm.

Burn-offs

We are at the time of year when the Fire Danger Period is rapidly approaching, and the last few months have been marked by below average rainfall in the District. Now is the time to be clearing up fuel from around your dwellings and sheds.

Please take care with your burn-off. Have a decent firebreak around it. Check the weather for the following few days. A lot of burns look benign by day's end, but then escape the next day when the wind gets up and blows sparks or hot coals into the grass. PLEASE register your burn with Fire Permits Victoria, It saves a lot of wasted time for our volunteers turning out to false alarm incidents.

HIGH COUNTRY HOMESTEAD

Oh, Spring! A time of renewal, blossoming flowers, and the gentle warmth of the sun returning after the long Winter. But not this year. No, this year, Spring decided to make quite the dramatic entrance—and I mean dramatic with a capital D!



Do you remember the week leading up to Spring? The wind was relentless, like nature itself was throwing a tantrum. Friends from Melbourne to Gippsland were all griping about the gusts that seemed determined to make us all take up kite flying. I've never been a fan of wind; it gets under my skin, makes my hair stand on end, and leaves me feeling like I'm in some horror movie where the wind is the villain.

But just when I thought things couldn't possibly get any worse—Mother Nature, in all her mischievous glory, said, "Just watch this!" The first day of Spring dawned with a torrential downpour, gale-force winds, and a thick mist that swallowed the world whole. It was as if Spring had decided to cosplay as the dead of Winter. By afternoon, the wind had revved up to a fever pitch, rattling windows, shaking trees, and making me seriously question if I'd wake up in Kansas the next day.

That night, I went to bed with a simple prayer: "Please, let these winds calm down by morning." It didn't! This wasn't just a hobby; this was our food for the next two seasons. And with no income apart from a few egg sales to neighbours, replacing it isn't an option. I'm devastated—utterly and completely gutted. The past fortnight has been one calamity after another—farm animal injuries, household pet injuries, even human injuries— our savings diminished by vet bills. Now this?

I'm sure, eventually, I'll come up with some brilliant plan to rebuild. But for now, I'm just standing here, dazed and confused.... And, if you happen to see a greenhouse flying through the air like something out of The Wizard of Oz, don't panic—you're not hallucinating. It's probably just my greenhouse, off to start a new life in the land of Oz.

Wonderings from the Wombat



Spring has definitely arrived with some glorious, mild days but boy was it cold over the 2nd weekend in September with snow falling on the Sunday. The daffodils along our driveway are looking really beautiful and, so far have only been briefly visited by the white cockatoos (.....maybe I speak too soon).

Kangaroos lounge in the paddock, overnight cultivation continues (wombats) and we see deer almost daily, although usually only fallow. We continue to hear the Boobook Owl nightly and also Nankeen Kestrels and cuckoos (Fan-tailed) calling during the day. I'm pretty sure that the kestrels are nesting in a tree somewhere nearby in the paddock but haven't watched them for long enough yet to discover where. They successfully raised a chick last year but have previously chosen nesting sites that were a bit exposed and lost their eggs/chicks to the Currawongs who are always on the lookout for an easy meal. Still hearing and occasionally seeing Gang-Gang cockatoos daily.

And, whilst I'm discussing birds, why do the Crimson Rosellas that live around our house always take off the minute you walk out of the door or around the corner of the house, yet those feeding right at the edge of the bitumen road when you're heading down to Mansfield, totally ignore the passing car? We don't feed them at home but neither do we chase them away so I don't understand why they see us but not a fast-moving car as a threat.

And another bird comment, for the first time since we've lived in Tolmie, last week I saw a magpie dive bomb the chooks. The rooster was not impressed and did his best to see it off but obviously he couldn't fly after it. When we lived in the Dandenongs, the magpies had a nest very close to the house and chook pen and did a lot of swooping when they were nesting, but only at the chooks and never at people fortunately (the chooks could just hide under a bush).

On a final note, I had another first this week......a spider in the teapot! This I am sure this has never occurred before, although maybe I just haven't noticed. I'd only made a pot of tea the evening before so it's not as if the teapot had been sitting unused for ages. Anyway, I spotted said spider (a Daddy Long-legs) before I added the tea and boiling water.

I hope you're all enjoying the beautiful mild days and looking forward to some good rain soon
